

Conflict Minerals Statement

RH Electronics, Inc. — Quality Management System · Document ENV-02 · Revised 2026

1.0 Purpose

This statement describes the position and practices of RH Electronics, Inc. regarding "conflict minerals" — tin, tantalum, tungsten, and gold (3TG) — as defined by Section 1502 of the U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act and the implementing rules of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These provisions address the sourcing of minerals whose extraction or trade may finance armed conflict in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and adjoining countries.

2.0 Scope

This statement applies to all electronic, electrical, and electro-mechanical components and related products distributed by RH Electronics.

3.0 Policy

RH Electronics supports the humanitarian objectives of the conflict-minerals legislation and is committed to responsible sourcing throughout the electronics supply chain. RH Electronics does not knowingly purchase or distribute products containing 3TG minerals that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the covered countries, and expects the manufacturers whose products it distributes to source responsibly and to conduct due diligence consistent with the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.

4.0 Role as a Distributor

RH Electronics is an independent stocking distributor. We do not manufacture components, and we do not purchase, smelt, refine, or introduce 3TG minerals into any product. The metallurgical content of a component is determined entirely by its original manufacturer. Conflict-minerals reporting obligations under the SEC rules apply to issuers that manufacture or contract to manufacture products; traditional component-distribution activities are outside the scope of those reporting requirements. Accordingly, smelter-level data and Reasonable Country of Origin Inquiry (RCOI) information originate with — and are maintained by — the component manufacturers.

5.0 Due Diligence and Customer Support

While the reporting obligation rests with manufacturers, RH Electronics actively supports its customers' compliance programs:

- We monitor conflict-minerals regulatory developments, including SEC guidance and industry-standard practices, as they affect the electronics supply chain.
- We obtain and pass through manufacturer conflict-minerals declarations — including Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) submissions — when published by the manufacturer and requested by the customer.
- We direct customers to the original manufacturer's published conflict-minerals position for the components on their bill of materials, and will assist in identifying the correct manufacturer contact when a declaration has not been published.

- Where a customer's purchase order imposes specific conflict-minerals flow-down requirements, we review those requirements at the time of quote and advise what can be supported for the parts in question.

6.0 Limitations

Manufacturer declarations are provided on an as-published basis. RH Electronics cannot independently verify smelter-level sourcing data and makes no certification of conflict-mineral content beyond the documentation issued by the original manufacturer. This statement does not constitute a Conflict Minerals Report under SEC rules.
